#### Possible Learning Objectives

- ★ Understand a new word Preposterous
- ★ To better understand literal and metaphorical meanings
- ★ To better understand homophones and homographs
- ★ To better understand alliteration



#### Possible Lesson Structure

Based on the learning objectives, here is one way you could lead a lesson:

**Introduction:** show the book to the children:

- \* Ask: Who knows what the word *Preposterous* means?
- **Explain:** The meaning of the word.
- ★ Read: The story and have the children join in saying 'that's preposterous Rhinoceros!'

**Engage:** Go through the story and point out when Rhinoceros is being preposterous.

- **Ask:** What is he doing wrong?
- **Explain:** Metaphorical and literal meanings



#### Take it further:

Go back again and point out instances of:

- ★ Homophones
- ★ Homographs
- \* Alliteration




